Hilary Hunt

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Hilary Hunt is a nationally recognized education consultant with fifteen years experience in the field of financial education. Her current consulting work ranges from curriculum development to research and program evaluation. Recent clients include Pennsylvania State University, The Heinz Endowments, Investor Protection Trust, and American Bankers Association.



Hilary served as director of the Pennsylvania Office of Financial Education under Governor Edward G. Rendell from its inception in 2004 until 2009. As director, Hilary oversaw the office's initiatives to increase the availability and quality of financial education in Pennsylvania's schools, communities, and workplaces. Hilary currently serves as president of the Pennsylvania Jump\$tart Coalition and is a past member of the board of Junior Achievement of Central Pennsylvania.

Hilary began her career in education as a secondary mathematics teacher in Virginia. She moved to Pennsylvania to serve as the vice president of Program Development with Economics Pennsylvania and from there went on to work for the National Jump\$tart Coalition for Personal Financial Literacy and the Foundation for Investor Education. Hilary received her Bachelor's of Science in mathematics from the College of William and Mary and her Master's of Science in Education Entrepreneurship from the University of Pennsylvania. She resides in rural Adams County, Pennsylvania with her husband Wade, a middle school principal, and their two young children.

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Holly Chase is a seasoned financial educator, writer, and presenter specializing in community-based financial education for adults. She has worked with national, state, and local non-profit organizations and government agencies in the areas of financial education program development, training, and outreach; trained over 1,600 educators, counselors, and social workers in financial content and delivery; and delivered over 200 financial education workshops to Pennsylvania consumers. Ms. Chase co-authored the EIFLE™ Award winning program, *Right On the Money*; developed the "Financial Education Boot Camp" educator training program; was nominated for the Secretary's Award for Excellence by the Pennsylvania Department of Banking.



Ms. Chase is currently the financial education officer with the Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency (PHFA). In this capacity, she leads the financial literacy initiatives and training across the organization, including housing counseling and education, housing services, and mortgage servicing divisions. Ms. Chase designed PHFA's flagship pre-purchase financial education program, *Building Your Financial House*, and the online borrower-delinquency prevention course, *Securing*

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Your Financial House. She also provides professional development, curriculum consultation, and outreach to national, state, and local housing community stakeholders and partners.

Ms. Chase began her financial career as an advisor with American Express Financial Advisors (now Ameriprise) and Merrill Lynch, followed by housing counseling and education with the Housing Alliance of York. Prior to joining PHFA, she spent several years with the Pennsylvania Office of Financial Education, supporting the financial education efforts of community-based organizations.

Andrew Hill is the economic education advisor at the Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia and adjunct professor of economics at Temple University. Andrew earned his B.S., M.A., and Ph.D. in economics from the University of Delaware. Prior to joining the Reserve Bank in 2002 as economic education specialist, he was visiting assistant professor of economics at Washington College in Chestertown, MD. In the college classroom, Andrew has taught principles of economics, labor economics, environmental and natural resource economics, and a seminar in writing economics for senior economics majors.



Andrew is a member of the American Economic Association, the National Council for the Social Studies, and the National Association of Economic Educators, and a 2001 recipient of the University of Delaware Excellence in Teaching Award. In 2012, he received both the Bessie B. Moore Service Award from the National Association of Economic Educators and the University of Delaware Presidential Citation for Outstanding Achievement. Andrew is vice president of the Pennsylvania Jump\$tart Coalition, a Leadership Philadelphia fellow, a former member of the board of directors of the Pennsylvania Economic Association, past chair of the Federal Reserve System’s economic educators workgroup, and past chair of the Federal Reserve

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Bank of Philadelphia diversity council. In 2004, Andrew was a participant in the National Council on Economic Education's Training of Writers program in St. Petersburg, Russia.

Andrew served as a member of the writing committees for the *National Standards for Financial Literacy* and *Focus: Middle School World History* and was a contributor to *High School Economics, 3rd Edition*. From 2011 to 2013, Andrew served as a member of the Pennsylvania Task Force on Economic Education and Personal Financial Literacy Education.
